1.	General instructions
•	Always use a spacer with / without a mask
•	Always take your reliever medicines with you
•	Wash your spacer once a month with soapy water
•	Let your spacer drip dry after washing
2.	When using inhaled steroid preparations
•	You inhaled steroid preparation is:
•	The mouth should be <b>rinsed</b> after using it or it should be taken before a meal or before brushing teeth.
•	On days you are using your reliever you should use the preventer <b>after</b> using your reliever
•	You should use the preventer every day as instructed
•	You should use it with the Spacer (Valve Holding Device) or with powder inhaler
<i>3.</i>	When to seek help form a doctor or asthma nurse
•	If you/your child has a bad attack or if you are worried
•	When you/your child starts the <b>ADDITIONAL</b> treatment
•	If you/your child needs the reliever (BLUE INHALER) more than every 4 hours
•	If you/your child needs the reliever (BLUE INHALER) every 4 hours for ONE DAY
•	If you/your child gets little or <u>no improvement from the reliever</u> (BLUE INHALER)
•	Wheezing lasts more than 24 hours <u>and</u> is not getting better
