

Why is it important to vaccinate health inclusion groups?

- High underlying clinical vulnerability levels in this group mean high risk of hospitalisation and death
- High risk of outbreaks in shared accommodation settings
- New variants

Vaccines continue to remain our best line of defence: vaccines are highly effective

- We continue to provide doses 1, 2 and the booster
- The spring booster (dose 4) COVID vaccination: older people and those with a weakened immune system.



Cumulative vaccinations in London (12th April 2022)

	Total number	In week doses	Uptake	
	Cumulative reported across London ICSs		Local intelligence	Nationally calculated denominator
First dose	10,372	+86	68%	66%
Second dose	7,009	+76	46%	45%
Booster dose Uptake as a % of 2nd dose	2,138	+63	31%

What is working well? (Groundswell report)

Communication

- Clear, appropriate, and accessible information about vaccines
- Highlight that vaccines are free and people have a right to access them
- Building trusted relationships to support making an informed decision

Flexible models of delivery

- Access to vaccinations is flexible and timely
- Outreach or in-reach models- Role of peer workers and staff who may be in a trusted position to offer support and information
- Holistic offer through a pop-up or health event
- Opportunistic vaccinations

Tips to promote vaccination uptake?

Coordinated response

- Co-ordinated work with partners: Public health, rough sleeping and housing leads, volunteers, ICS
- Motivation: not static and may change over time and therefore it is important that we offer doses 1, 2 and the booster vaccines
- Ideally offering a health event that includes wider health promotion and checks, the offer of vaccination, foodand a bit of fun!
- Fast pass: people have been given a fast pass to track people quickly at vaccination sites so they are prioritised

How can you support the vaccination N/ programme?



- ✓ Prioritisation of health inclusion groups for COVID vaccinations
 - ✓ buy-in of service teams appears linked to higher uptake. Staff are encouraged to get vaccinated.
- ✓ Partnership working with public health, LA, CCG, voluntary sector.
 - ✓ working with your vaccination borough lead to jointly plan and actively. monitor offers and uptake

✓ Provision

- ✓ support data collection and vaccination which can be recorded on CHAIN
- ✓ support the planning of a vaccination 'outreach' or 'drop in' with providers, and work in advance to encourage vaccination. Use peer support where possible
- ✓ outreach teams/staff have a key role identifying, encouraging and escorting individuals to 'drop in'/walk-in sites

Everybody has the opportunity to get vaccinated and no-one should be left behind
